Lucie Sedláková Hůlová is a sought-after Czech violinist, chamber musician and music pedagogue, graduated from the Prague Conservatory and from the Prague Academy of Music (Masters degree). Lucie has to her credit an impressive list of solo appearances with Czech orchestras as well as with partners in various chamber music combinations.

She regularly plays with her husband, cellist Martin Sedlák, as the Czech String Duo, and together with pianist Veronika Böhmová they form the Kinsky Trio Prague. Lucie frequently played with her father, respected violinist Pavel Hůla. After his death she took over the artistic direction of the Praga Camerata orchestra, where she has been member and soloist since its foundation in 2001. Lucie plays with her husband Martin and their children Magdalena and Lukáš in a family string ensemble Sedlák Virtuosi.

Since 2019 Lucie is the artistic director of the international chamber music course "Pellegrina with Kinsky Trio and Friends".

In 1997 Lucie was a member of the European Union Youth Orchestra, conducted by Bernard Haitink. In 2000 – 2006 she was a member of the UBS Verbier Festival Orchestra where she played with many of the world's most famous and respected conductors and soloists all over the world.

Lucie is engaged in performing baroque and 18th century music in authentic interpretation and on authentic instruments, both as soloist and as a member of specialist ensembles (Musica Florea, Collegium 1704, Capella Ornamentata, etc.). Her solo CD of Biber's complete Rosary (Mystery) Sonatas with the Czech organist Jaroslav Tůma is well received by professional critics.

Lucie has given hundreds of concerts at international festivals and in the most famous concert halls all over the world. She has also made a number of recordings for Czech Radio as well as several CDs.
